**Newtown Savings Bank Announces Branch Relocation Date and Open House**

NEWTOWN, CT – Newtown Savings Bank announced that the opening date for their new branch at 32 Church Hill Road in Newtown will be Monday, September 25<sup>th</sup>. The branch, including branch manager Ryan Storms and his entire staff, will relocate from the existing 39 Main Street address after close of business on Friday, September 22<sup>nd</sup>. Each of the Bank's 13 other branches will be open as usual on Saturday, September 23<sup>rd</sup>.

The new branch will feature an expanded lobby as well as two drive-up banking lanes and both drive-up and walk-up ATMs. In addition to the branch, the new building will also house residential mortgage originators and the Newtown Investment Solutions team. The Bank's Administrative Offices and the existing drive up ATM will remain at 39 Main Street.

"We are very excited to be part of the terrific new Lexington Gardens complex" said John Trentacosta, the Bank's President and Chief Executive Officer. "Our new location in the heart of Newtown's business district will offer our customers an increased level of convenience and enhance our interactions with other local businesses".

The public is invited to a preview Open House at 32 Church Hill Road on Wednesday, September 20<sup>th</sup> from 9 am to 3 pm when tours will be offered throughout the day. The new branch features an original art display by Newtown artist Charles Fulkerson. The display is titled "Painted Ladies" and features twelve historic homes along Main Street. Another highlight is a reproduction of the original mural depicting Newtown civic and commercial landmarks that was painted in 1964 at the 39 Main Street location by local artist Elizabeth Turner-Hall, formerly known as Elizabeth Hoeffner. There is also a Newtown map from 1868 displayed in the entrance way of the new building.

"The new branch is intended to be more than just another bank branch" said Ken Weinstein, Executive Vice President. "After more than a century on Main Street, we wanted to make sure that our new headquarters branch reflected our history in Newtown and our commitment to the Newtown community".
